

## Disability hip hop project by Kolkata Centre for Creativity and Wild At Heart LOCKDOWN E BONDHO "BECAUSE OF THE LOCKDOWN" Single Release and Simultaneous International Launch 3<sup>rd</sup> December - International Day Of Persons With Disabilities

**Kolkata, 03 December 2021:** The project '*Lockdown E Bondho "Because Of The Lockdown'* is designed and directed by Reena Dewan, Director of Kolkata Creativity Centre and Phil Heuzenroeder, Executive Director of Wild At Heart. Dewan and Heuzenroeder met as participants of an international arts leaders program in 2019 and share a passion for access to creativity and community.

The ground breaking intercontinental disability hip hop project, *Lockdown E Bondho "Because Of The Lockdown"*, will launch to an international audience simultaneously in Melbourne and India on 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2021.

*During the lockdown, f*acilitated by Kolkata Centre for Creativity and Wild At Heart had 6 students with intellectual disabilities from Manovikas Kendra School in Kolkata, India and 13 young Australian disabled hip hop artists who produced a bilingual hip hop track over Zoom in a bilingual workshop setting. The project involved writing, recording, filming and launching the music video in this ground breaking intercontinental cross-cultural collaboration.

The project explored the experience of the story tellers across two cities throughout the extraordinary period of the Covid19 pandemic - the struggle and suffering, the human solidarity and desire to overcome as told through the unique voice of people with disability. The English and Bengali title, *Lockdown E Bondho* translates to "Because of Lockdown".

Iconic Bengali rapper Cizzy (Kolkata) and Professional hip hop artiste Yung Philly (Melbourne) facilitated the writing, beat making and recording of the new song. Film makers from each city worked with the young disabled artists to shoot footage in both cities which was edited in Kolkata to create a unified music video from two distinctly different lands.

"Art has an empowering purpose as it is a phenomenal tool for self-expression. Through this multicultural collaborative project, it has been established that Art can facilitate self-expression and if right support is provided people who are differently abled can practice and create outstanding works. I hope we see these young performers forming a hip hop crew in future someday," said Reena Dewan, Director of Kolkata Centre for Creativity.
