

## Nuclear Medicine gets established as the emerging area of advancement in medical science in Eastern India at AMRICON Nuclear Medicine Update 2016

Since nuclear medicine procedures are able to pinpoint molecular activity within the body, they offer the potential to identify the disease in its early stage and ensure a patient's immediate response to therapeutic interventions. Nuclear medicine imaging procedures are noninvasive and, with the exception of intravenous injections, are usually painless medical tests that help physicians diagnose and evaluate medical conditions.

Addressing the audience at the inaugural ceremony, **Prof. Dr. Bhabatosh Biswas**, Vice-Chancellor, West Bengal University of Health Sciences, said, "Nuclear medicine started with diagnostics later getting into therapeutic and now there are a lot of unresolved problems where the role of nuclear medicine has become important. Teaching and training of nuclear medicine is also gaining prominence in the country. Though it started late in West Bengal it has slowly gained the momentum in institutes like AMRI. The hesitant phase of nuclear medicine has gone and today we are at a crossroads where it will grow bigger ".
